ederal and state government agencies do not provide grants to veterans for starting a usiness. However, the SBA offers a program to help veterans obtain low-cost startup nancing the SBA Veterans Advantage Loan.
 SBA Veterans Advantage Loan - provides "fee-relief" to veteran-owned small businesses to reduce the barrier of access to capital. Visit the Lender Match to find SBA-approved lenders. SBA Military Reservist Loan - provides financial relief to businesses that have an employee who has been called to active duty.
